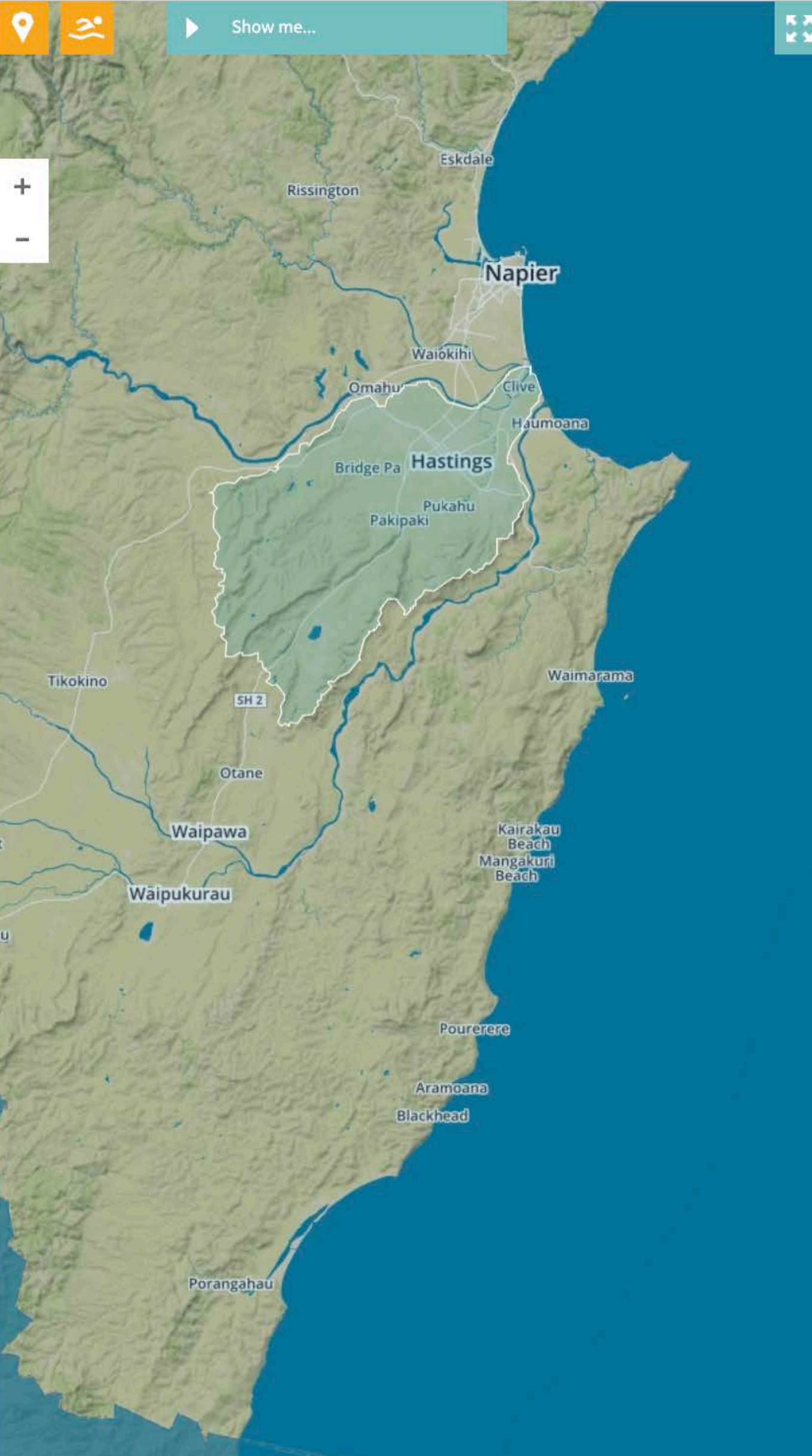

Karamū Stream is a gently flowing waterway with areas of public reserve. It takes water from as far as Pekapeka wetland and Bridge Pa before flowing by Havelock North to merge with the Raupare Stream and become the Clive River near Whakatū in Hastings.

Key achievements over time frame

- Soil conservation**
500 hectares of soil conservation measures were implemented
- Planting/fencing**
10 kilometres of riparian margins were planted
- Wetland management**
Incididunt ut labore et dolore magna aliqua. Ut enim ad minim veniam, quis nostrud.
- 60% of grazed land has excluded stock from waterways - compared to 40% in 2020
- Group B stock wintering practices are being used on 20km² - compared to 2km² in 2020
- Group C low tillage practices are being used on 10km² - all introduced since 2020
